

The Pawhuska Food 4 Kids Backpack Program is up and running once again!

We have had the privilege of serving 70 children with the distribution of 366 sacks of food during the month of October, as the program relaunched on October 1st of this year.

The Food 4 Kids BP Program strives to meet the needs of children who are at risk of being hungry over the weekend, when school meals are not available. Weekly sacks include dairy products, proteins, fruits/vegetables, and grains to attempt to supplement nutritional needs. Children receive individually packaged, easy-to-open food items, such as shelf-stable milk, pudding cups, cheese cracker sandwiches, sunflower seeds, lasagna, red beans and rice, cereal and 100% juice.

The Pawhuska Ministerial Alliance partners with Christ's Cupboard, area churches, businesses and individuals to help provide the necessary manpower, finances, food supply and distribution of the items to students. It is certainly a team project as we currently serve students at Pawhuska Elementary and Indian Camp Elementary schools.

Cost for this endeavor is approximately \$40 per month per child, with a school year estimate of \$360 per year. Our number of students increased from 54 to 70 within the month of October, and we anticipate more student participation as we move into the winter months. Our cost for the rest of this school year (6 months), will reach approximately \$16,800.
